Prayer for the Day

Bountiful God, through your Son you have called us to repent of our sin, to believe the good news, and to celebrate the coming of your kingdom: teach us, like Christ's first apostles, to hear the call to discipleship, and, forsaking old ways, to proclaim the gospel of new life to a broken world; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Theme

Traditionally, when a new year begins, there is an expectation that resolutions will be made to bring about change in our lives that in some way that will do us good. In the reading from Jonah we discovered that when God is in charge it is possible to live our lives differently. Jonah consistently resisted God's call to "cry out against Ninevah" because of the wickedness of its people and even went in the opposite direction to get away from God. Eventually, as we hear in today's reading, Jonah gives in to God and goes to Nineveh as commanded, with the message from God that "in forty days" Nineveh will be destroyed. The people believed God's message and repented, lives were changed for the better.

Jesus' mission began with his announcement that "The time promised by God has come at last!." In today's gospel reading we hear how Jesus begins his ministry by calling ordinary people like you and me to follow him. He sees fishermen Simon and his brother Andrew and calls them to follow him. A little further on he sees Zebedee's sons, James and John and calls them as well. Ordinary people going about their ordinary jobs. It may seem strange in this world in which we live, where money and status matter, that this is the way Jesus works. Jesus invested great faith in those men, as he does for us today, offering us a whole new life on a journey with him.

Prayer

Parish Pub Night: Friday 9th February at 5pm at World's End, Fraser Cove shopping centre. All welcome.




